Entergy opens magic building

Entergy Mississippi recently held a ribbon cutting and open house to celebrate what they call a “magic building.”

The company, which has had a presence in downtown Senatobia since 1960, outgrew their Center Street facility and recently opened a \$4.5 million, 15,000 square foot building in the Senatobia Industrial Park.

Local leaders such as Senatobia Mayor Alan Call-

icott and Tate County Economic Development Foundation Executive Director Janie Mortimer called Entergy a “good partner” in economic development. Entergy has been a key player in negotiations for recent projects, including Industrial Park neighbors PK USA and Twin Creeks Technologies.

In fact, Entergy Mississippi President Haley Fissackerly said that his company was partnering with their next-door neighbor, Twin Creeks, and would be

installing some of the company’s solar panels at the facility in a pilot program.

Other “green” features of the building, which is the first Green Globe certified facility in the state, include lights which turn on and off automatically, based on the activity in the room, and the latest in lighting technology.

Entergy also plans to build a new sub-station on the property in the near future.
